Our Rooms

Wisconsin Rapids Location

The facility is three levels, with shared apartment style units. Units range in size from 1-2 bedrooms. Fach unit has its own kitchen, living room, and bathroom. Each bedroom has 2 single adult beds. For example: A 2-bedroom unit can have up to 4 adult single beds available.

Genesis program participants share a unit with bunk beds. Families have private apartment units. Participants have access to on-site shared laundry and a shared common space for events, programming, and leisure.

Marshfield Location

The facility is two levels. Participants are provided single beds in private rooms, except for Genesis Program participants, who share a room. Participants share the living room, kitchen, bathrooms, and laundry. Housing is provided to single individuals only.

Applicants must be 18 years or older to apply. An interview and background check are required. An arrest record does not deny entry into the program. People who have been convicted of a sex-related crime are not eligible.

What is Transitional Housing?

The US Department of Housing and Urban Development defines transitional housing as "temporary housing that provides support services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness with the goal of stability and support to successfully move to and maintain permanent housing."

*Mary's Place is not an emergency shelter. The application process is required for all programs.

Our Core Programs

We offer a Temporary Shelter program and a Transitional Living Program for individuals 18 years and older and for families. All program participants receive additional services based on their unique needs. Services include:

- Basic Needs Assistance
- Case Management
- Mentoring/Life Coaching
- Job Service Referral
- Financial Guidance

Core Program Details

Temporary Shelter

The goal of the temporary shelter program is for individuals to gain a source of income and move into the transitional living program as a pathway to long-term more permanent housing.
